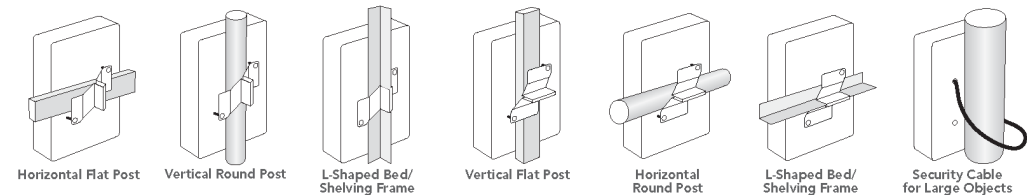

If You Want to Mount your Tablet Safe Using the Bracket

The Tablet Safe is designed to fit on flat or round furniture posts up to 4" wide and L shaped bed frames and shelving up to 1.5" deep. You should measure your furniture to be sure it is the size you expect. For example, a 2 x 4 board is actually 3.5 inches wide and 1.75 inches deep. An optional security cable is also included for use with irregular objects.



Tablet Safe Recommendations

It is easier if you have a friend help you install your Tablet Safe safe in your dorm room or apartment. One person to hold the Tablet Safe and one person to install the bracket and fasten the nuts on the inside of the Tablet Safe. If you are going to install the Tablet Safe by yourself, consider some way to brace the Tablet Safe while you install the bracket and fasten the nuts. Rest the Tablet Safe on boxes, or the back of a chair, or a stack of books. Just remember to be careful. If the brace falls and then the safe falls you could get hurt.

The Tablet Safe is designed so that its weight wants to lean on your bed-post or furniture. You want to fasten it tight enough that it won't move. This will happen before you can stop turning the nut. Stop fastening the nut when you lean on the Tablet Safe and it won't move.

In our literature, we refer to the fact that when the Tablet Safe is properly installed it attaches easily and harmlessly to your loft-bed post or furniture. We would like to review how you might improperly install the Tablet Safe:

- If you use a bolt that is not fully threaded, the wing nut may not sit firmly against the back of the Tablet Safe and it can move or fall on your furniture.
- The Bracket assembly uses steel bolts and steel nuts and you can continue to tighten the nuts after the Tablet Safe is secured which will compress (mark) the furniture. The Tablet Safe is secure when it won't move when you lean on it (not stand or jump on it).
- If you tighten one bolt to a far greater degree than the other bolt the bracket bar will not sit flat against the bed post or furniture, which may encourage you to overtighten the bracket assembly

Use a Bolt that is the Correct Length to install your Tablet Safe

The bracket assembly works with 3/8" carriage bolts of different lengths. For example if your bed post is 2 inches long, the Tablet Safe needs a 3" bolt. You would use the 4/12" bolt included in your hardware kit or you could purchase 3" carriage bolts at a hardware store or home center. If your bed post is 3 1/2 inches long, you need a 4 1/2" bolt. The minimum recommended bolt length is 3/4" inch longer than the loft-bed or furniture post. Your hardware kit includes the most common sizes 2 1/2" and 4 1/2".

Bracket Installation Instructions

- Place 2 Carriage Bolts that are at least 3/4" to 1" longer than your post through the Bracket with the square holes. You can use a longer bolt, it will just extend farther into the body of your Tablet Safe. If you do not have a bolt that is the desired length you can go to any hardware or home center store and buy the 3/8" carriage bolts you need.
- Place the Tablet Safe against the bed-post or furniture. Remember, having a friend help you is best! If you are doing it yourself consider carefully bracing the Tablet Safe.
- Align the bracket using the illustration guide on the first page for the different applications. Horizontal flat post, Vertical Flat Post, Horizontal round post, Vertical round post, Horizontal L Frame, Vertical L Frame.
- Place the Bracket on the opposite side of the bed post or furniture and insert the Carriage Bolts through the holes in the Tablet Safe.
- Place and fasten the 2 wing nuts to the 2 Carriage Bolts on the inside of the Tablet Safe. It is important that each nut be fastened to the same depth on each bolt. For instance, one bolt should not have 1/2" showing beyond the nut while the other bolt has no dimension showing beyond the nut.
- This completes the bracket installation process.

Security Cable Installation Instructions

- Place the Security Cable around the fixed object that will secure the Tablet Safe and thread one end through the eyelet at the other end of the cable making a noose around the object.
- Slide the 1" bolt through the remaining eyelet on the Security Cable. Put the bolt through any one of the holes on the back of the Tablet Safe and fasten it with a wing nut.

How to Set the Combination on Your Padlock

Every Tablet Safe comes with a high security combination padlock. If you wish to replace it, choose a padlock with a shackle that is less than or equal to 9/32" diameter. Padlocks range in price and security features.

Your new resettable combination padlock is preset at the factory to unlock at 0-0-0.

- Step 1: Leave dials at the opening combination 0-0-0 and pull out shackle.
- Step 2: Turn shackle 90 degrees and press the notch on the shackle down into the notch on the lock body as far as it will go.
- Step 3: While the shackle is depressed, set the dials to your own combination.
- Step 4: Release the shackle and return it to the regular position. Your padlock will now open to your personal combination.
- Step 5: You can reset the combination as often as you like. Just open the lock and follow Steps 2,3 & 4.
- Step 6: Don't forget your combination. Make a record and keep it in a safe place.
